- a. The fifth sign: The light of the world brings sight to the blind and blindness to those who will not see. (John 9: 1-41)
- b. The good shepherd, his sheep, and the hirelings. (John 10: 1-42)

Please read through chapter 9 and 10 using the outline above and continue to note out what the above heading teaches you and how it can apply to those around you. Continue to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit during your study, and your everyday living.
